We will encounter others more frequently, so please continue to be respectful and give them space. Along with walkers, runners and strollers, there will be bicycles. Motorists shall be reminded; State Law requires you to keep at least 3 feet of space between your vehicle and a cyclist. With common courtesy, common sense and respect for the rules of the road, Farmington can be safer for everyone.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Town employees who continuously go above and beyond their respective duties, to ensure that Town residents continue to receive exceptional services. For instance, the Public Works Department continues to oversee projects to improve Farmington's infrastructure. Each year, we pave or reconstruct many of our local roads. As the paving season commences, please show your appreciation by slowing down and giving space to our hard working employees.

This Winter, the Town Council established the Ad-Hoc 1928 Building Committee, to recommend various policy decisions about the future of this historic building. In March, the Committee sent out a survey to the community, to gather your opinions on the different options. The Town Council will be reviewing the survey's findings, on April 26th. I encourage everyone to continue to follow this process.

This year's 24th Annual Town-Wide Clean-Up Day, led by the Farmington Green Efforts Committee, is scheduled for Saturday, April 23rd, from 8:00 am - 1:00 pm. On March 21, 2022, the Town Plan & Zoning Commission voted to approve the Town of Farmington's application, for a special permit and site plan, for construction of a new high school, at 10 Monteith Drive. TSKP Studio and professional partners continue to work to refine the design development documents.

The committee recently voted to approve an Early Enabling Package, which will limit the disruption to school operations, by allowing some site work to occur, during the summer of 2022.

FALL ABSENTEE BALLOTS

The election this Fall will be held on November 8, 2022. College students, and anyone who will be out of town on Election Day, may request an Absentee Ballot, from the Town Clerk's office. Applications will be kept on file, and ballots will be mailed starting October 7, 2022, which is the first day regular absentee ballots become available. Stormwater Runoff Polution: Car Washing

If you wash your car on the street, in the driveway, or parking lot, then soap, scum, and oily grit will be washed into the nearby storm drains, which drain to our nearby wetlands and rivers, such as the Roaring Brook, Pequabuck and Farmington Rivers, without any treatment. This causes pollution that is unhealthy for fish and people. How do we avoid this mess?

Take your car to the car wash, where wash water is filtered and recycled, instead of washing it in the driveway; or wash it on the lawn, so the rinse water will be filtered through the lawn and soil.

Help Preserve Farmington's Wetlands and Streams

Is your backyard frequently wet? Do you have a brook or stream that runs through or near your property? If so, you may need a permit with the Inland Wetlands Commission, before you clear parts of your property. *Call the wetlands staff at 860-675-2325, to discuss your project, before you start work.* We are happy to help you determine if a permit is needed, and discuss ways to protect the wetlands and streams.

Remember, most stormwater in town eventually flows to the Farmington River!

Town of Farmington to Continue Revaluation Process

The Town of Farmington is continuing the process of revaluing all real estate within the town, as of October 1, 2022. By state law, Connecticut towns and cities are required to revalue real estate, once every five years. The last time this was done in Farmington was 2017.

Revaluation is the equalization of property values, by estimating the current market value of all properties in town, as of the same date. The values derived in the revaluation will be used in the assessment of real estate and the levying of taxes, until the next revaluation.

Tyler Technologies, Inc. has been hired to assist the Assessor with this project. Data collectors, working for Tyler, will visit each residential property, to verify the exterior (including measuring), and inspect the interior, with the permission of an adult occupant of the property. Given the current situation, it is possible that other means of updating the interior information may be needed, such as property questionnaires. Commercial and industrial properties will also be inspected.

Cyclomedia is working with Tyler Technologies, to update the property photos for the Assessor's records, which was last done town-wide, in 2017. Photos are taken from the street. One photo, for each building, will be included on the Assessor's cards (property record cards), just as they are now.

General Reminders for Trash & Recycling:

- To ensure proper trash and recyclable pickups, all are required to be at the curbside the night before your normal trash/recycling day.
- Carts should be placed within 6 feet of curb, 4 feet away from other objects, and with the front of the cart facing the street. Do not place carts in the roadway.
- Always bag trash, to keep cart clean and allow trash to flow out freely.
- Do not overstuff carts lids must be closed. Recycle boxes must be cut to size, with lid closed.
- Do not leave anything on the side of the carts pick up is only for what is in the cart.
- Wash/clean regularly, with ammonia or disinfectant cleaner, to deter animals.
- Keep bears and other animals away from your carts, by taping dryer sheets to the inside of the lid.
- No bulk items, construction debris, hazardous items, or flammable materials in carts.
- · No grass clippings, branches, or lawn debris in carts.
- No plastic bags, soiled pizza boxes, Styrofoam, or other foam plastics in Recycling carts.

Town of Farmington Adopts New Wildlife Safety Ordinance

The Town of Farmington adopted a new ordinance in November, prohibiting intentional feeding of wildlife, restricting the usage of bird feeders during certain months, and improper storage of food, pet food, refuse, or other attractants and substances, in a manner that results in wildlife feedings.

This ordinance was implemented to assist residents, guests, and other stakeholders, in coexisting with wildlife peacefully and safely. Every year, Farmington's Animal Control Officer and the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection, receive numerous calls regarding nuisance wildlife, including bears. These animals are usually attracted to the area, by a source of food. This source can be improperly stored refuse, bird feeders, or other attractants. The wildlife activity has interrupted school activities, sporting events, and everyday life, for some residents. We're glad that this ordinance will help us in educating the community and affecting positive change, to safeguard our citizens and wildlife in our area.

Tunxis Mead Compost Area Rules - For Residents Only

2022 Spring/Summer Days & Hours:

Wednesdays & Saturdays, 8:00 am - 12:00 Noon

Residents may bring brush, leaves and pallets to the Compost Area, at no charge. Also allowed: clean lumber and plywood (NO pressure-treated, stained or painted wood). This material is ground up to make bark mulch. Stumps and grass clippings are NOT allowed. A photo ID, showing your Farmington address, is required. Gate closes promptly at 12:00 noon. For further information, contact the Highway & Grounds Division of Public Works, at 860-675-2550.

Logs over 6" (six inches) in diameter must be cut into 2' (two foot) lengths, and require residential tickets, as listed below:

RESIDENTIAL TICKETS: \$8.50 per ticket (Purchase at Highway & Grounds Division of Public Works, 544 New Britain Ave., M - F, 8:00 am - 4:00 pm)

Passenger vehicles1 ticket per load = \$8.50 Small trailer (towed)......2 tickets per load = \$17.00 Van/pickup under 3/4 ton.....3 tickets per load = \$25.50
