- Recognitions: The Town Council presented Senior Center employees Andrea Bouchard and Nicole McClintock with the "Lifesaving Award" for assisting in the life-saving efforts of a resident experiencing a cardiac event. Armed with a defibrillator and their knowledge of CPR, Andrea and Nicole were able to sustain the gentleman's life until paramedics arrived.
- <u>FHS Building Project</u>: The Connecticut General Assembly passed special legislation that set the reimbursement rate for the FHS Building Project at 30%. This represents a significant increase in the reimbursement percentage initially set by the CT Office for School Construction Grants & Review. This change will reduce the cost to the Farmington taxpayers.
