0722-02: Devonwood resident requesting to drive her golf cart to Winding Trails.

information.

0722-03: Resident on Burlington Road is requesting a "stop ahead" sign southbound on River Road prior to the intersection with Burlington Road

• The project to reconfigure River Road will be commencing and will help with line-of-sight issues. Until then, there will be a "stop ahead" sign placed on the corner of Hemlock Road and River Road.

0722-04: Received complaint that the traffic lane at intersection of Birdseye Road and Route 6 seems to be too narrow.

The group is in need of clarification as to which lane he's referencing. Several members
of the committee had driven by and didn't notice any lane being too narrow. Town
Manager's office to email complainant.

Item is Tabled until there is further clarification.

- **0722-05:** Received complaint about traffic light at Fienemann Road and Farm Springs Road cycling continuously with zero traffic.
 - The light is designed to cycle and cars exiting the highway can trip the cycle as it was designed. Traffic Officer will ensure that it's cycling properly.

0722-06: Resident requesting No Thru Trucks on Old Mountain Road.

According to the CT General Statute Section 14-298, there isn't sufficient evidence to
prohibit trucks as it isn't a public safety issue and the street width, line of sight, etc., are
adequate enough for trucks to pass through.

Old Business:

0622-06: Request for traffic signal for Farmington Avenue in Oakland Gardens. (placed at corner of Farm. Ave at Crescent Street)

 Town Highway honored several requests. Speed and accident surveys were completed and neither justifies putting a traffic light where it was requested. Traffic Officer will return in September (start of school) and run speed/traffic data to see if that changes the need for a light. Traffic officer updated complainant.
