A Note From Our Town Council Chair

"Summer's lease hath all too short a date." - William Shakespeare

The summer season already seems to be in full swing; the Community and Recreational Services' concert series has begun, the museums are running their warm weather programs and the riverfront is attracting crowds. I try to make it a habit of bringing an empty bag with me when I am using outdoor space, just in case someone missed an item when cleaning up.

I am excited to share that the Town recently received a grant from AARP, which will enable us to add a kiosk, benches, and a bike rack along the trails.

In addition, we have a number of major projects going on, during the summer months. I am pleased that the Main Street sidewalk replacement in Farmington Village, and the painting of the river bridge in Unionville are among those, and are also being funded by outside sources, not your local tax dollars.

The Farmington High School Building Committee is preparing for the construction of the new building, and I am happy to report that groundbreaking is on schedule for the fall of 2022.

A separate committee, the 1928 Building Committee, has also been formed. This committee meets regularly to help determine the future of the 1928 Building, which is part of the current high school structure. This past spring, a survey was sent to residents, to collect their input regarding options for this building. 73.7% of the respondents expressed interest in retaining this nearly 100-year-old building. The committee is studying various options, to propose as the next steps. It is anticipated that a decision will be made, at a referendum to be held, in May of 2023.

In other Town news, the Town Budget passed in May, with a modest increase of 1.80%, below our historic average of 3%.

On June 29th, Farmington swore in Colin Ryan, as the 8th Police Chief, for the Town of Farmington. Chief Ryan has worked for the Farmington Police Department for 23 years, and was the Police Captain since 2017. We also welcomed a new Director of Fire and Rescue Services, Thomas Fitzgerald, who was Captain of the New Haven Fire Department and served 23 years there.

Finally, on behalf of the Town Council, I want to congratulate the Farmington High School Class of 2022 and their families. The graduation ceremony was a great evening, with perfect weather.

I hope you all enjoy the summer.

FHS Building Committee Update

The Farmington High School (FHS) Building Committee remains focused on completing the detailed building design and cost estimate, in preparation for bidding to occur in late summer, and construction of the new high school facility to start this fall. The Building Committee is working collaboratively with Town and District representatives, as well as our professional partners, to carefully balance cost and design, in this very challenging market environment.

Preliminary site work for the project began in mid-July. The FHS Building Committee found value in completing these items over the summer, before school starts, so there are no student disruptions and new traffic patterns are established for the first day of school.

Below is a project list of work to be completed, between July 2022 and September 2022:

- Site and building preparation
- Security fencing and perimeter erosion control
- Relocation of site utility lines
- Building a temporary school parking lot, next to the library, at the base of the hill
- Creating a new traffic pattern

Notes From Maureen Frink, Town Clerk

A Primary will be held on August 9, 2022, from the hours of 6:00 am - 8:00 pm. Absentee ballots become available on July 19, 2022, for the Primary.

To vote by absentee ballot, you must first complete an application for the ballot. You may obtain the application by any of the following methods:

- at the Town Clerk's office,
- by calling the clerk's office (860-675-2380),
- by emailing (frinkm@farmington-ct.org),
- from the Town of Farmington website, farmingtonct.org, under the department of the Town Clerk.

The last day for Veterans to file a DD214, at the Clerk's office, to receive a tax exemption, effective for the following year is **September 30, 2022**.

Election Day is November 8, 2022. Voting hours are 6:00 am - 8:00 pm, at your polling place.

Absentee ballots will be available for the November Election, by mail or in-person, from the Clerk's office, on **October 7, 2022**, following the same procedures as above.

Building and Planning Division Reminders

Summer is a great time for outdoor projects. Please remember to file the necessary registrations and building permits for your projects.

Fences: Fences over 7 feet tall require a Building Permit. Fences 7 feet and under are required to be registered with the Planning Division. There is no fee for registration with the Planning Division.

Shed/Accessory Structures: Sheds or accessory structures over 200 square feet require a Building Permit. Shed or accessory structures 200 square feet and less are required to be registered with the Planning Division. There is no fee for registration with the Planning Division.

Swimming Pools: Swimming pool installation requires a Building Permit for the installation of above-ground and in-ground pools.

Working with the Building and Planning Divisions at the start of your project will help ensure the work complies with Building and Planning regulations, and will avoid having to correct your project.

Share the Road

The Town of Farmington Bicvcle Advisory Committee would like to remind everyone of the State of Connecticut Law, requiring motorists to allow at least three feet of separation when overtaking and passing a cyclist.



- Drive Cautiously.
- Reduce speed when encountering cyclists.
- Don't tailgate, especially in bad weather.
- Recognize hazards cyclists may face and give them space
- Pass with care. Give cyclists at least 3 feet. It's the law. Keep at least 3 feet of space between your vehicle and a cyclist.
- You may cross the center line to pass a cyclist, if it's safe. Vehicles may overtake and pass pedestrians, bicycles, and other obstacles, even in a marked, no-passing zone, provided such overtaking and passing may be conducted safely, with adequate sight distance and without interfering with oncoming traffic.

Improved Lawn & Yard Maintenance = Improved Stormwater Quality

- sidewalks, and roads. If you apply fertilizer shortly before a heavy rainstorm, much of it will be washed into nearby storm drains, wetlands, streams, lakes, and rivers. So, when you fertilize your lawn, apply it well in advance of a rainstorm, use it sparingly, use organic slow-release fertilizers, and always follow manufacturer's recommendations. The University of Connecticut Cooperative Extension system has useful information regarding lawn maintenance tips, as well as a Nitrogen Fertilization Calculator. This information can be found at:

- 2. Vegetate bare spots in your yard, to prevent soil
- 3. Use a mulching lawn mower in lieu of bagging and disposing of your yard waste. Mulching returns nutrients back to the soil and eliminates yard waste.
- 4. Instead of using pesticides, consider Integrated Pest Management techniques. Integrated Pest Management is a sustainable approach that provides long term solutions to pest problems. Additional information can be found at the UCONN Cooperative Extension website: ipm.uconn.edu/root/.
- 5. Direct downspouts away from both your foundation and paved surfaces. Consider installing a rain garden or rain barrel, as a great way to recycle water, and to use around the yard for watering gardens. General Reminders for Trash & Recycling:

- To ensure proper trash and recyclable pickups, all are required to be at the curbside the night before your normal trash/recycling day.
- Carts should be placed within 6 feet of curb, 4 feet away from other objects, and with the front of the cart facing the street. Do not place carts in the roadway.
- Always bag trash, to keep cart clean and allow trash to flow out freely.
- Do not overstuff carts lids must be closed.
 Recycle boxes must be cut to size, with lid closed.
- Do not leave anything on the side of the carts pick up is only for what is in the cart.
- Wash/clean regularly, with ammonia or disinfectant cleaner, to deter animals.
- Keep bears and other animals away from your carts by taping dryer sheets to the inside of the lid.
- No bulk items, construction debris, hazardous items, or flammable materials in carts.
- No grass clippings, branches, or lawn debris in carts.
- No plastic bags, soiled pizza boxes, Styrofoam, or other foam plastics in Recycling carts.

Tunxis Mead Compost Area Rules -For Residents Only

2022 Summer Days & Hours:

Wednesdays & Saturdays, 8:00 am - 12:00 Noon

Residents may bring brush, leaves, and pallets to the Compost Area at no charge. Also allowed: clean lumber and plywood (NO pressure-treated, stained or painted wood). This material is ground up to make bark mulch. Stumps and grass clippings are NOT allowed. A photo ID, showing your Farmington address, is required. Gate closes promptly at 12:00 noon. Logs over 6" (six inches) in diameter must be cut into 2' (two foot) lengths, and require residential tickets, as listed below:

RESIDENTIAL TICKETS: \$8.50 per ticket

Passenger vehicles	1 ticket per load = \$ 8.50
Small trailer (towed)	2 tickets per load = \$17.00

Water Pollution Control Facility (WPCF) Upgrade Update



The Farmington Water Pollution Control Facility treated 1.36 billion gallons of wastewater from Farmington, Unionville, Avon, Canton, and Burlington, Connecticut, in 2021. The regional facility achieved removal rates of over 98% for both BOD (Biochemical Oxygen Demand) and TSS (Total Suspended Solids).

The upgraded facility has a capacity of 6.30 MGD and a design peak of 18.97 MGD. During Tropical Storm Ida in September, the Farmington WPCF saw peak flows of 20.7 MGD, exceeding plant design. The facility performed without incident over this 72-hour period. There was not a single permit violation during the tropical storm.

In early 2021, the facility began work on a hybrid tank to further reduce total nitrogen and phosphorus in the effluent. The retrofitted tank added mixers and a RAS recycle line to supply the aeration tanks with increased levels of BOD and carbon, for nitrification and Bio-P (Biological Phosphorus Removal). In its first year of operation, the tank eliminated the need for chemicals for phosphorus removal, and the facility was able to achieve its lowest total nitrogen in plant history.

The 2018 plant upgrade and new hybrid tank have helped the Farmington WPCF reduce its energy and chemical costs. Plant management, operations, and maintenance will continue to work towards optimizing and enhancing plant processes.
