

FARMINGTON HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMISSION
REGULAR MEETING

October 18, 2022

Present for the online web conference was Chair Honeyman, Commissioners Bombara, Calciano, Hatzenbuhler, Phelan and Alternate Commissioners Gemski and Sanford. Town Planner Rutherford, Clerk Michaud and Town Council Liaison Connolly were also present. The meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Town of Farmington/Farmington Libraries – 71 Main Street and 2 School Street

Application for Temporary Certificate of Appropriateness to install wireless bridge on the exterior of 71 Main Street and 2 School Street. Brian Rush, Information Technology Manager, stated they are looking to install two wireless dishes to enable a network connection between these two buildings. One dish will be installed on the front of the school to the right of the entry door tucked in the corner of the building and the dish at the library will be installed under the eave on the north side of the building. The dishes are sixteen inches in diameter and the mounting bracket will be behind the dish. The Commission asked clarifying questions about the dishes, locations and wiring.

There was no public comment in favor or in opposition to the application.

The public hearing closed at 5:07 p.m.

VOTED: To approve the Town of Farmington/Farmington Public Libraries application for Temporary Certificate of Appropriateness to install wireless bridge on the exterior of 71 Main Street and 2 School Street, as presented and on file in the Planning Office.
